SoFi SoFa Stadium?

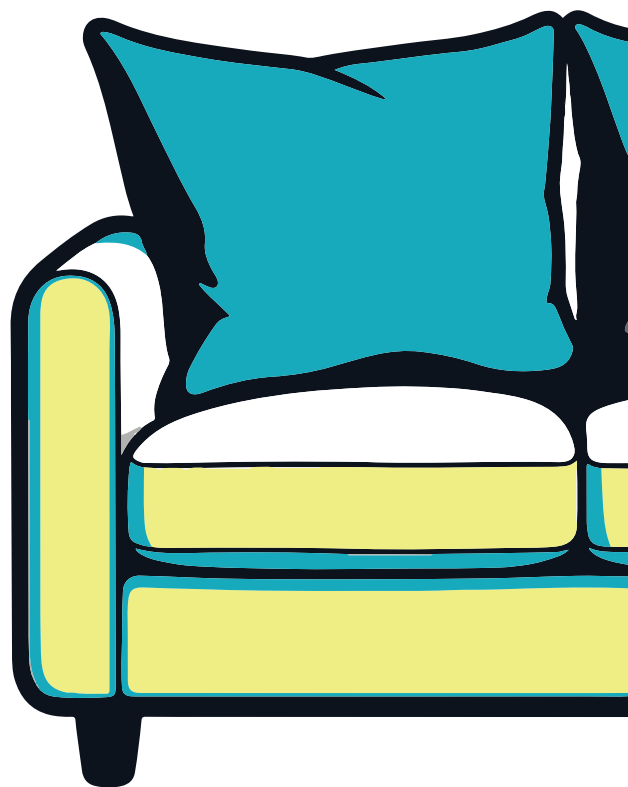
THE FIFA WORLD CUP, THE PINNACLE OF INTERNATIONAL SOCCER, HAS BEEN CAPTIVATING FANS WORLDWIDE SINCE ITS INCEPTION IN 1930. THIS ONCE EVERY FOUR YEAR TOURNAMENT HAS WITNESSED COUNTLESS ICONIC MOMENTS, THRILLING MATCHES, AND LEGENDARY PLAYERS.

For the second time in the history of the competition, World Cup games will be played in the United States, and more specifically Los Angeles. Were you there in 1994? The Rose Bowl played host to the most matches of any host city, eight, including the World Cup Final between Brazil and Italy!

The match was a cautious, defensive battle, with Brazil's Romário missing a close header and Italy's Roberto Baggio, hampered by injury, forcing a save from Cláudio Taffarel. Ending 0-0 through 90 minutes, with extra time yielded no goals either, the crowd was witnessed the first World Cup final decided by penalties. In the shootout, Brazil's Márcio Santos and Italy's Franco Baresi missed early attempts. Brazil's Romário, Raimundo, and Dunga scored, while Italy's Daniele Massaro was denied by Taffarel. Then came the big moment where Italy's star, Roberto Baggio, struck his must make penalty over the bar securing Brazil's fourth World Cup title, ending a 24-year drought, while Italy fell short despite a valiant effort.

What iconic moments will LA fans be treated to this year? Similarly to 1994, Los Angeles will play host eight matches next summer, including the USMNT's opening game on June 12th, 2026. Other matches include:

- 5** Group Stage Matches
- 2** Round Of Sixteen Matches
- 1** Quarterfinal Match





The question for many people is: Will you be lucky enough to watch at SoFi or from your SoFa?

It will not be the Rose Bowl who plays host in 2026, that honor goes to SoFi Stadium, located in Inglewood. The state of the art 5.5 BILLION! dollar stadium will try to recoup some of that money by hosting not only the World Cup matches but also the Los Angeles Summer Olympics in 2028. Tickets for the 2026 FIFA World Cup at SoFi Stadium are sold exclusively through FIFA's official channels (e.g., lotteries and resale platform) and use a dynamic pricing model, meaning costs can fluctuate based on demand.

Just as I have failed to win Masters tickets (the golf tournament) via their lottery the past 13 years, I fully expect to miss out on the opportunity purchase tickets at face value. So the question for many people is, will you be lucky enough to watch at SoFi, or watch on your SoFa? USMNT matches command premiums due to local the local appeal obviously. However, the resale for the previously mentioned June 12th opener hit \$2,950 for a \$560 face-value Cat 4 ticket within days. Prices could double closer to the event, so SoFi Stadium it is!

The excitement for the 2026 FIFA World Cup is building, and I'm absolutely thrilled! There's something different about the United States hosting, right? As much as I enjoyed waking up at 3:00am to watch games like Ghana vs. Serbia during the 2010 World Cup in South Africa, the summer of 2026 will be even better. More convenient game times mean sharing the excitement with friends and family at local watch parties, rather than with just you and your coffee mug. Bars and restaurants will be buzzing, and chip-and-dip sales might rival Super Bowl levels! Whether we're watching at SoFi Stadium or from our sofa, the energy around USMNT and Mexico game days will electrify our local communities. I can't wait!

This Is the Story All About Soccer.

It all started with a dream to help children with obesity and lack of opportunities. We live in a world full of greed and competition, where if you don't have money and a good, physically competitive body, the clubs or recreational leagues don't give you opportunities on the fields to have fun, compete, and dream of greatness. And there is another challenge even worse: our parents, who work all day every day and don't have time to take us to training and games.

I myself lived through all that—my worries and lack of commitment to my children. I neglected them physically; they gained weight, and then no one gave them an opportunity on their teams. After a car accident, I spent four years in a wheelchair, unable to walk. From that wheelchair, I began the journey to train children who didn't even know how to kick a ball. I enjoyed teaching them so much that boys and girls started coming to be trained. In three months, we began playing in a recreational league and managed to win a consolation cup. What a joy to see the children enjoy their triumph—for them, it was like winning a World Cup!

We continued to grow, and the children began to succeed more and more. Then the pandemic came, and we lost a couple of months. They called me to ask if I was still training, and I told them no. But I gathered my courage, and in the middle of the pandemic, I called them and started training again. Only three children showed up for four months. Then more started arriving, and soon I had 13 players ready to compete at the highest level.

We started at level 3, dominated it, and won 9-0. Then level 2—the same result. Then level 1. We reached gold, then the premier level. We have played against the best players from each club, but unfortunately, we could not continue due to lack of money, since it requires large amounts.

I myself have helped the young players by taking them in my car. Sometimes I have to transport up to eight players when we play in Irvine, CA, or even farther away. Helping them is also a pleasure, since when they play, they give their best. The satisfaction of seeing how well they play, directing them on the field like professionals, and beating the rich clubs is priceless.

I hope, with the help of my Lord Jesus Christ, that some of these young people achieve their dream of playing at a professional level in a club that gives them the opportunity, since they have worked hard since they were very young and now they are ready.
